LEGAL NOTICE

In accordance with Connecticut General Statute 12-40, all persons who are liable to pay taxes on tangible personal property belonging to them on October 1, 2022, are hereby notified that they must file a declaration of their personal property on or before November 1, 2022, with the Assessor, or be subject to an estimated assessment and the statutory 25% penalty.

Various exemptions are explained on the declaration and available if filed on time.

**NO DECLARATION IS REQUIRED FOR MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED IN WILLINGTON CT**

**NO DECLARATION IS REQUIRED FOR REAL ESTATE**

Personal property includes, but is not limited to, unregistered motor vehicles (including junk autos), campers, all business machinery, equipment, tools, commercial furniture, and fixtures.

**DEFECTIVE CONCRETE**

Applications and Engineer Evaluation forms to request reassessment of residential property due to defective concrete are available in the Assessor's Office and on the Town of Willington website. Please note, these forms must be accompanied by an engineer's report. Filing deadlines for various exemptions and classifications for the 2022 Grand List are as follows:

**PUBLIC ACT 490**

All applications for classification of forestland must be received by October 1, 2022. All applications for classification of farmland and open space must be received by October 31, 2022.

**VETERANS**

All property owners claiming exemption due to military service must file their DD214 form with the Town Clerk by September 30, 2022. Discharge paperwork is only filed once.



Veterans claiming disability exemption must submit proof from the Veterans Administration. PA 85-573 allows veterans an additional exemption if their income is within the approved limits. This application must be filed by October 1 bi-annually.

#### DISABILITY

Persons totally disabled receiving SSD benefits may be eligible for a \$1000 property exemption. Proof of award and application must be submitted by October 1, 2022.

#### HOMEOWNERS & TOTALLY DISABLED

Residents 65 years of age or totally disabled may be eligible for a tax credit on real estate; income guidelines apply and are adjusted each year. You must request an application in February 2023 and file it on or before May 15, 2023.

#### RENTERS

Residents 65 years of age or totally disabled may be eligible for the State Renters Rebate Program. Guidelines and applications will be available from the Human Services Department between April 1 -October 1.

## Fire Marshal

During the pandemic, The Open Burning Official had been issuing Burning Permits verbally. Unfortunately, this procedure has ended. The actual Open burning Permit form is again being used, in this change, you will need to follow this procedure.

There is no cost for this permit.

Most permits can now be obtained by simply e-mailing me at [dpalmer@willingtonct.gov](mailto:dpalmer@willingtonct.gov) requesting an Open Burning Permit. I will e-mail you this blank permit. Once you completed the top portion, you will need to return this back to me. I will then complete this form, highlighting the burning index web site, and a number to call prior to burning, back to you. If you cannot complete this e-mailing procedure, then call my office at 860-429-7757, and we will make arrangements to meet with you, in order to complete this form.

So far, this procedure has worked well; we may through time need to adjust this. Please allow yourself plenty of time in your burning activity.

This past spring, Willington’s Human Services Department along with Willington Parks and Recreation presented a proposal to the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) commission requesting all six weeks of summer camp this year be paid for with the ARPA funds. Once approved, we were able to accommodate up to 50 kids per week, for a total of 300 slots available in our summer camp program! **FOR FREE.**

There were two factors in our decision to do this:

1. Summer camp, and indeed all recreation programming, was severely impacted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Not only were programs shut down, but the Human Services Department was inundated by urgent matters as a result of the health crisis and economic impact of the pandemic, and therefore unable to devote the time or resources to assist in any collaborative programs.
2. There are reports of increased rates of depression and anxiety disorders in school aged and adolescent children resulting from the pandemic. This large summer camp program not only allows for safe socialization of children, it also permits activities that otherwise have not been enjoyed in the previous two years.

Our summer camp program also employs not only staff, but our “Counselors in Training”, who are 13-15 year old children. This program allows for them to develop their skills and learn to be our summer camp counselors of the future. Additionally, our CIT program gives them responsibility, a sense of normalcy, and above all else, much-needed social interaction.

We have invested in a number of items to improve our program long-term. This year, we have purchased a bounce house, games, water slides, and other activities that we can use in the future. We plan to get this program bigger, better, and more self-sustained than ever before!

We thank you for your support in this endeavor and we look forward to a summer of fun!

## PROPERTY TAX BILLS HAVE BEEN MAILED

*1<sup>st</sup> Installment Due by August 2, 2022*

### How can I pay My Bill?

The Revenue Office accepts cash, money orders or personal checks for payment at the office. If our office is closed, you can leave a check in one of our Drop Boxes located outside the front entrance of our building. Our mailing address is 40 Old Farms Rd, Willington CT 06279 if you want to mail in a payment, we would appreciate a contact phone number in the event we need to get in touch with you. Please enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope if you would like a receipt mailed back to you. You may also pay online at [www.willingtonct.org](http://www.willingtonct.org) and click on the button that says “**Online Payments.**” There is a convenience fee of 2.95% for credit cards and \$1.95 for EFT. We also have a public kiosk at Town Hall for online credit/debit card payments. The same fees apply.

### When is my Payment Due? When is it considered Late?

Payments that are due July 1, 2022, must be received, or postmarked, no later than August 2, 2022. Payments that are due January 1, 2023, must be received, or postmarked, no later than February 1, 2023.

Interest is charged at a rate of 1 ½% per month from the due date, with a minimum interest charge of \$2.00. ***Per §12-146, Interest cannot be waived.***

### What am I being Taxed on?

You are being taxed on Real Estate, Personal Property and Motor Vehicles as of October 1, 2021.

Real Estate – All real property listed on the Grand List.

Personal Property – In the most general terms, personal property is everything subject to ownership, excluding land, any interest in land or any permanent improvement thereon. It is property that is not permanently affixed to or part of real estate. By its very nature then, personal property is moveable. This broad definition includes tangible items such as airplanes, campers, unregistered vehicles, items for business as furniture, fixtures, equipment, and animals.



## Tax Collector cont.

Registered Motor Vehicles – Vehicles listed with the Department of Motor Vehicles are coded by tax town, and the Assessor is provided a list of registered vehicles annually. Willington's Town Code is 160.

All tax bills are mailed directly to property owners unless the Tax Collector receives specific instructions to send the bill to your bank or financial institution.

Real Estate and Personal Property tax totaling \$100 or more are due in two installments: July and January. Motor vehicle tax is due in one installment in July. Please note, we do not send out bills for the second installment in January. There is a stub on the July bills for the January payment.

It is still not too late to license your dogs! Please remember: Connecticut General Statute §22-342 denotes that every dog must be licensed annually. The fees are \$8 for each spayed/neutered dog and \$19 for each male/female dog. Please do not forget to include the additional \$1 penalty per dog for the month of July or each month thereafter. More information can be found at: [willingtonct.org/town-clerk](http://willingtonct.org/town-clerk).

Speaking of dogs, we want to see our 4-legged licensed residents! Please send us a photo of your dog for our “dog wall” located near the service counter in the Town Clerk’s office. The bulletin board gets a lot of attention when people come to conduct business and we love to show them off!

Veterans who served in the military during a time of war (or Active Military), and own property or motor vehicles in the Town of Willington may file their military discharge paperwork to be eligible to receive tax exemptions. The original DD214 (or a certified copy) must be filed with the Town Clerk, at which time an Armed Services receipt will be signed as well. The deadline to file is September 30<sup>th</sup> each calendar year. If you have questions regarding your exemption qualifications, please contact the Assessor’s office at 860-487-3122.
