Updates on Requests heard at Public Hearing

ARPA-33. Flags, Grave Markers ad Monument Repair: There was a general discussion about the status of this project between the Commission and the applicant. It was agreed that there still needs to be additional coordination with the Board of Selectmen regarding the long-term management and costs.

T.Smith made a motion to to Approve ARPA-33 as submitted. Second by E. Wiecenski.

E. Wiecenski stated she felt there needed to be to be more discussion related to how this will work over the long term since the Town does have budgeted expenses for this. What would happen if things changed down the road?

R.Cambell spoke to how it had been handled previously and what the budget used to cover. Has concerns that down the road after the money is spent the costs will then come back to the Town. There should be a plan in place

M.D'Amato stated that he felt that for consistency with how other project requests had been handled, he felt that ARPA needs to understand how this will affect the Town's operating budget moving forward.

T.Smith made a motion to table the motion with the expectation that discussion is held with the Selectmen. Second by R.Campbell

ARPA 32: Retention Bonuses for Town Employees.

C.Mailhos gave an overview of the BOF discussion and the Email that had been received. (At this time, T.Sposato, J.Arpin, R.Campbell, D.Latinscics left the meeting room and were not present for this discussion)

The Commission members held a general discussion about the project the indication that the Board of Finance felt this should be sent to a vote at Town meeting.

E. Wiecenski indicated that she supports and stands by the project and the Ordinance which allows the ARPA Commission to make these decisions. She further indicated that she is not opposed to Town input, but the process is the process as outlined in the Ordinance

M.D'Amato indicated that he is strongly in support of the request as someone who is not included in the funds to be spent. This project request was developed by the BOS to compensate the employees for their work during covid. The amounts provided to each employee were indicated within the request and developed transparently by the BOS.

J.Arpin, T.Sposato, R.Campbell and D.Latinscies indicated they would not be participating in a vote for this request should a vote occur.

T.Smith made a motion to send ARPA 36 to Town Meeting. Second by E.Wiecenski C.Mailhos stated that she plans to go to this Town Meeting in support and explain why she supports. She would vote no if it went to approval by ARPA.
