

Dear Willington Residents,



Assessor



Just a reminder that mailed applications for the income based **Elderly/Totally Disabled Tax Relief Program** are due by April 15th, 2018. Anyone applying between April 15th - May 15th must apply in person. May 15th, 2018 is the last day we can accept applications. We will be happy to assist you in filing your application. Please call in advance for an appointment so we may provide the time and attention necessary; 860-487-3122.

The Town of Willington is scheduled to begin a Revaluation of real estate to be effective October 1, 2018. In coming weeks, mailers will be sent to all property owners within the municipal limits; inspections are expected to begin during the spring of 2018. The information below should assist with preparing for the process.

WHAT IS A REVALUATION? Revaluation is the process of estimating new real estate values, based on specific rules and current data. This requires revaluing all properties at the same point in time to provide uniformity in property assessments and to ensure that all property owners are paying only their fair share of the cost of community services. State statute requires that properties are assessed at 70% of their current fair market value as of the date of the revaluation.

Revaluation is **NOT** intended to raise revenues.

WHY IS A REVALUATION NEEDED? The State of Connecticut, under provisions of Section 12-62 of the CT General Statutes, requires a revaluation of all real estate at least once every five years. It is an unfunded State mandate. Willington completed revaluations in 2008 and 2013.

WHAT IS FAIR MARKET VALUE? Section 12-63 of the CT General Statutes requires properties reflect their fair market value, and NOT the value at a forced or auction sale. Fair market value is a standard defined by the courts as the price established between a willing buyer and willing seller, taking into consideration all the uses to which the property is adapted.

HOW DOES THE NEW ASSESSMENT AFFECT MY TAX BILL? The revaluation project sets new values (not taxes) for the real estate portion of the 2018 Grand List. When values are finalized in April 2019, your elected officials will have the Grand List information needed to establish mill rates. Tax bills reflecting the 2018 assessments will be issued on July 1, 2019.

WHO WILL CONDUCT THIS REVALUATION? The Town contracted services with the professional real estate valuation company, Vision Government Solutions, Inc.

Preventing Lyme Disease

Preventing Lyme disease takes thoughtful preparation. It requires that you prevent ticks from getting on your skin. When you go outside into areas where ticks can be found, it is helpful to:

- Avoid tall grass and over-grown, brushy areas.
- Stay in the middle of the trails when hiking in the woods.
- Wear light-colored clothing so the ticks can be easily seen.
- Wear long pants to provide a better barrier than shorts.
- Tucking pants into socks creates a barrier and ticks will not be able to get to your skin.
- Wear long-sleeved shirts and closed shoes when in tick infested areas.
- Use insect repellent to significantly reduce the chance of tick bites and the transmission of Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases.
- DEET is the primary active ingredient in most tick repellents and is considered the most effective. It must be used as directed on the container.
- Examine yourself, your children, and pets for ticks when returning indoors.
- Remove feeding ticks as soon as possible. Ticks need to feed for 24 hours before transmission occurs.
- When returning indoors, shower using a wash cloth or buff to remove walking ticks on your body. Ticks have a tendency to walk on the body before biting and feeding.
- Talk to your veterinarian to find out how to protect your pets from tick bites.



The sooner ticks are removed from the body the less likely you will get Lyme disease. Most people with Lyme disease do not remember being bitten by a tick because a tick bite is not felt; unlike mosquito bites. Ticks are very small and difficult to see, and many people do not get the expanding red rash that resembles a bull's eye and identifies Lyme disease infection. **If you have any signs or symptoms of Lyme disease, especially after a tick bite, contact your doctor right away.**



Burning Official

Open Burning Requirements—The following requirements are effective January 1, 2000.

The Fire Marshal will issue all 'Open Burning Permits'. Permits can be obtained by calling (860) 429-7757. If the Fire Marshal is not available, please leave a message with your name, address, and phone number. The Fire Marshal will get back to you as soon as possible.

- *Burning Permit requests will be taken Monday through Thursday **Only**.*
- Permits will then be delivered to the Willington Fire Department #1 on Friday mornings. The Willington Fire Department #1 is located at 426 River Road, Willington CT. Please schedule your project accordingly.
- Burning is to be Done by Permit **ONLY**. Failure to obtain a permit may result in police action. You may only burn on a low or moderate fire hazard day. Once you receive the permit you must call (860) 424-3630, or go to...
www.ct.gov/dep or www.tollandcounty911.com to see the burning index for that day online. There is no longer the requirement to call the dispatch center.

These are the rules that apply to burning brush:

- Brush must be 4 inches or less in diameter.
- The fire must be attended at ALL times.
- Burning must be on the property for which the permit is issued. Houses under construction and businesses may NOT burn.
- Burning must be conducted between 10 am and 5 pm on sunny or partly sunny days with wind speeds less than 15 miles per hour. The fire must be completely out by 5 pm.
- Burning isn't allowed during High or Extreme Hazard conditions.

The following items are NOT to be burned - Demolition waste, garbage, paper, plastic, painted materials, rubber, metal, leaves or stumps.

Complaints received about unattended fires or fires left burning, can lead to the State of Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection issuing a 'cease recreation burning' for the occupant and/or property owner. Brush can also be taken to the Transfer Station on Hancock Rd, Willington during normal operating hours.

Permits are NOT required for the following:

1. Barbecues or other outdoor cooking.
2. Campfires, bonfires with brush under 3-inch diameter and 4-foot diameter circle for recreational or other activities including ceremonial purposes. All fires must be completely out when finished.

"Only you can prevent wildfires!"**



Connecticut traditionally experiences high forest fire danger in the Spring from mid-March through May. DEEP's Division of Forestry constantly monitors the danger of forest fire to help protect Connecticut's 1.8 million acres of forested land. Throughout the Spring forest fire season, DEEP sends daily advisories on forest fire danger levels to DEEP's state park forest field staff, municipalities, fire departments and the media. Forest fire danger levels are classified at low, moderate, high, very high or extreme. In an average year approximately 500 acres of Connecticut woodland are burned by forest fires.

If you have received a permit from your local Open Burning Official to burn brush on your property, the permit is not valid if the Forest Fire Danger is rated **high, very high or extreme** **AND** you are burning within 100 feet of a grassland or woodland.

If you spot a forest fire, remain calm, go to the nearest telephone and dial 911 to report the fire as quickly as possible to your local fire department. Calmly tell the emergency dispatcher when you saw it and where you saw it.

Stay on the telephone until the dispatcher tells you to hang up.



Center Elementary School—PreSchool Registration



Willington Center School's PreSchool will be accepting applications for the 2018-2019 school year. Children eligible for PreK must be three years of age by August 31, 2018 and cannot turn five before January 1, 2019.

Applications will be available March 1, 2018 by calling Center School at 860-429-9367. The application and the Ages & Stages questionnaire will need to be completed and submitted by May 1, 2018. Decision regarding acceptance will be made by June 8th.

Center Elementary School—Kindergarten Registration



Willington Center School is currently encouraging parents/guardians to begin registering their children for kindergarten for the 2018/2019 school year. Children must be 5 years old on or before January 1, 2019. Please call Center School at 860-429-9367. Orientation will be held in the spring.

Conservation Commission

Spring is here and with it comes the opportunity to watch nature unfold from its winter hibernation. Put your walking shoes on, grab your binoculars and camera (and take the usual tick-deterrent steps!) and go out and observe the wide variety of wildlife and plants as they bring new life to the forests, wetlands, fields, ponds and waterways in Willington's extensive nature preserves.

The 300-acre Fenton-Ruby Park and Wildlife Preserve and Drobney Sanctuary on Moose Meadow Road has 4-plus miles of trails through woods, over ridges and along ponds and streams. A kiosk with maps is located at the parking area, and a box with nature trail guides is located a short distance down the Taylor Trail. Several picnic tables and benches are available in the picnic area adjacent to the parking lot and overlooking the beaver pond.

Several new features are now in place at Fenton-Ruby. Trail maps are now located at all trail intersections to help orient you if there are no maps at the kiosk or if you choose not to carry a paper map. A deck for wildlife observation and fishing is located at the edge of the beaver pond. The Ashford Link Trail now connects the Fenton-Ruby system to a 1-mile loop trail on the Langhammer Preserve in Ashford. This .1-mile link, shown on the trail maps, runs from the Ruby Trail to Lustig Road with the Ashford trail immediately across the road.

The trail register on the Taylor Trail indicated that there were over 900 trail-users in 2017! (We're guessing that was likely less than half the actual number - many regular hikers, for example, don't register every time - and also that's only one trail in the Park.) Visitors indicated they were from 24 towns in CT and 11 states. So, if you haven't been there yet, come out and see what others come far and wide to appreciate!

Please abide by Park regulations to help make visiting an enjoyable experience for everyone. The opportunity to observe wildlife in this sanctuary will be greatly increased for all if pets are kept on leashes. Wildlife will adapt to the presence of people, not so much to pets.

The 28-acre Talmadge Tract, which contains the Talmadge Spur Trail with 1 ½ and 2-mile loops, will take you through scenic woodlands and along gravel Mason Road. This tract abuts the 400-acre UConn Moss Forest Tract, and on the other side of Mason Road is the 138-acre Royal Knowlton Preserve. Several miles of the Connecticut Blue Trail (Nipmuck) run through this area, with a portion along the Fenton River as it flows through a deep ravine. The 3/4-mile Knowlton Spur Trail connects the Nipmuck Trail to the Talmadge Trail. Maps can usually be found at the sign at the Talmadge/Knowlton trailheads on Mason Road where there is now a parking area, and also at the sign where the Nipmuck crosses Mason Rd. Brochures and trail maps for both of these areas can also be found at the Town Clerk's office and the library, and the same information is available for Fenton-Ruby on the Conservation Commission website (see below).

Willington Parks & Recreation Commission

Our commission requires seven members per the Board of Selectmen, and we presently have six members. It is a non-compensation position and has a term of three years. The Commission meets on the last Monday of the month and is responsible for the oversight of our town's recreation facilities, recreation programs within and beyond those facilities, and managing the development of new facilities and programs.

With one seat still available, if you are interested in becoming a member, please contact the Parks & Recreation Department. The commission will meet with all respondents.

The Recreation Commission meet the last Monday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Office Building—Selectman Conference Table.

Policies & General Information

Fees: There will be a \$20.00 fee for all checks returned as unpaid due to insufficient funds, stop payment, or any other form of cancellation. Payments shall be made by check or cash. Credit cards are not accepted. All checks should be made out to the Willington Parks and Recreation Department or WPRD.

Financial Assistance: Funding is set aside to assist Willington families that require financial help in registering for programs. For further information and an application, please contact the Human Services Department at 860-487-3118.







Tax Collector



We are looking forward to the summer!!!! We enjoy seeing you all in July!

As a reminder, tax bills will be mailed out June 30th. These bills will be due July 1st, and may be paid without penalty until August 1, 2018. If you do not receive a bill, please contact our office at 860-487-3111 or email me at collector@willingtonct.org. Please note, that per §12-130 "Failure to send out or receive any such bill or statement shall not invalidate the tax." Or in simpler terms, failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the taxpayer of his/her responsibility for the payment of taxes or delinquent charges. So please make sure to reach out to our office if you do not receive an expected bill.

What am I being Taxed on?

You are being taxed on Real Estate, Personal Property and Motor Vehicles as of October 1, 2017.

Real Estate – All real property listed on the Grand List.

Personal Property – In the most general terms, personal property is everything subject to ownership, excluding land, any interest in land or any permanent improvement thereon. It is property that is not permanently affixed to or part of real estate. By its very nature then, personal property is moveable. This broad definition includes tangible items such as airplanes, campers, unregistered vehicles, items for business as furniture, fixtures, equipment, and animals. Registered Motor Vehicles – Vehicles listed with the Department of Motor Vehicles are coded by tax town, and the Assessor is provided a list of registered vehicles annually. Willington's Town Code is 160.

All tax bills are mailed directly to property owners unless the Tax Collector receives specific instructions to send the bill to your bank or financial institution.

Real Estate and Personal Property tax totaling \$100 or more are due in two installments; July and January. Motor vehicle tax is due in one installment in July. Please note, we do not send out bills for the second installment in January. There is a stub on the July bills for the January payment.

How can I pay my bill?

The Revenue Office accepts cash, money orders or personal checks for payment at the office. If our office is closed, you can leave a check in our Drop Box outside the front door of the building. You may also pay on line at www.willingtonct.org and click on the button that says "OnLine Payments". There is a convenience fee of 2.95% for credit cards or \$1.95 for EFT. You can also call 844-859-7566 to pay by phone, but an additional fee of 75 cents will be added. We do have a public access computer at Town Hall which will allow you to make a credit card payment on line.

Fishing & Hunting

Springtime is in the air and that means fishing. Opening day for Trout Fishing is April 14, 2018, second Saturday in April. Licenses are available in the Town Clerk's Office or on line at www.ct.gov/deep. The Guide Books are available on line at www.ct.gov/deep/fishing or www.ct.gov/deep/hunting or are in the Town Clerk's Office. The Trout and Salmon Stamp is now required for fishing in any waters where they stock trout and salmon. The cost is \$5.00. You can contact DEEP by phone (860) 424-3105 with any additional questions. Any Connecticut Residents 65 years of age or older are entitled to a free license. Anyone with a "Lifetime" has to renew each year if you are a hunter or if you salt water fish. Make sure you bring in your old license with the conservation number on it.

You can license your dog in person or by mail. All dog license requests must be received in this office in person or in the office via the mail by June 30th. If mailed, for us to process your license.

An updated rabies certificate, if not current is required, a check payable to the Willington Town Clerk and a self-addressed, stamped envelope should be included, if by mail. New dogs being registered would need the rabies certificate, spayed/neutered papers, check payable to Willington Town Clerk and a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

Please register your dog in June to avoid additional late fees as of July 1st. There is a \$1.00 per month and \$1.00 each additional month per state statute.

Chenes Roches Preserve:

Chenes Roches (transl. oaks rocks) is a 56-acre wooded preserve in northeast Willington and owned by Joshua's Tract Conservation and Historic Trust. Trails wind through a varied terrain of hardwood forests, stands of pines and along a hemlock-shaded stream in a steep-sided valley. A round trip of 1.8 miles will take you across several small spring-fed streams and an altitude change of about 250 feet from the parking lot to the valley stream. A trail map and additional information about the preserve, including directions, can be found on the Joshua's Trust website, joshuastrust.org. There is a kiosk with trail maps at the small parking area 500 feet past the south end of Laurel Drive. ***Please stay on the trail and respect boundaries where the trail passes near private property.***

Note: The parking area is not plowed in the winter and parking on the road is not advisable.)

River Road Athletic Complex - 511 River Road:

Baseball field, basketball court, pavilion, playscape, swings, multi-sport field, volleyball sand court, walking path (one lap = .33 miles) and outdoor fitness equipment. No golfing allowed.
