SNOW REMOVAL ORDINANCE

Volume 6, Page 81 Pursuant to Section 7-148(15), Connecticut General Statutes, use of Town roads is restricted as follows:

No person shall deposit any snow or ice onto the traveled portion of any Town road. Any person found guilty of a violation of this section shall be fined fifty (\$50) dollars by the Board of Selectmen or the Public Works Director.

This includes the draining of water from sump pumps and/or other property drainage. Besides the Town fine, residents are also liable for damage to the road and any accidents that may occur as a result of water, ice or snow deposited on the roads.

WINTER PARKING BAN

A parking ban is in effect during snow storms. Cars parked on Town roads overnight may be towed at the owner's expense. Tune to WFSB (CBS) or WVIT (NBC) for parking ban information.

MAILBOXES

Your mailbox should be in good repair, firmly attached to a solid post and properly placed so no part of it is over the pavement. It will have to withstand countless tons of flying snow this winter and may require periodic maintenance. If a mailbox or post is pushed over or damaged as a result of snow or slush coming off a snowplow, it is considered a winter hazard and the Town will not repair or replace the mailbox or post. The height of the bottom of the mailbox to the street should be between 42" – 48" and the mailbox door should be 6 to 8 inches back from the front face of the curb or road edge. In the event a Town plow hits a mailbox, it will be repaired by the Public Works Department.

PORTABLE BASKETBALL HOOPS

Portable basketball hoops and similar items should NOT be in the Town right-of-way. The Town is not responsible for damage done by plows to such items left in the Town right-of-way.

CATCH BASINS & STORM INLETS

Do not blow leaves into catch basins or storm inlets. Help minimize street flooding by blowing leaves or shoveling snow and ice from in front of the storm inlet nearest your house. This includes keeping catch basin grates free of leaves and other debris all year long!





ROOF PROJECT UPDATE ...

We did it! With an ongoing joint effort over the last 12 months, the Society worked for a \$8,975.00, 50/50 matching grant from The 1772 Foundation in cooperation with The Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation. FREE SNOWSHOE LOANER PROGRAM

Bring on the Snow!!! The Willington Parks and Recreation Department has snowshoes that were obtained through a grant from Eastern Highlands Health District initiative "Healthy Eating, Active Living" (HEAL). The Department has 4 sets of adult and 4 sets of youth snowshoes for use. Loaner equipment is available for pick up Monday-Friday. Reservations must be made at least 48 hours in advance. Only one open reservation will be allowed per household. After the completion of one reservation, another will be allowed. Maximum rental is three days.

Why go snowshoeing? What started thousands of years ago as a mode of transportation has evolved into a popular winter activity for recreation and fitness. Here's why:

It's fun: Snowshoeing extends your hiking or running season into winter. It lets you enjoy winter solitude and can be a social activity. All ages and ability levels can enjoy the sport together. It's easy: As the saying goes, "If you can walk, you can snowshoe." The learning curve is much shorter than that of skiing or snow-boarding. A few techniques worth practicing: widening your stance (to avoid stepping on snowshoe frames), going up and down hills, traversing slopes and pole usage.

It's inexpensive: Required gear includes snowshoes, appropriate footwear and clothing, and (maybe) a pair of poles. That's it! No lift ticket is required.

It's a good workout: Snowshoeing offers low-impact, aerobic exercise that helps you stay in shape during the winter. It's versatile: You can go easy or go hard. Plus, you can snowshoe



How does it work? The resident contacts the Human Services office. After some financial information is obtained and long-term sustainable solutions are discussed, the office contacts a local supplier who delivers 100 gallons of oil to the family's home.

The fuel bank is an income-based program, and is meant for a one-time emergency only.*

Gardiner Hall Jr Museum is About Willington History



The Gardiner Hall Jr Museum and Willington share a rich history from 1861 to its halt in producing threads in the 1950s. One hundred years of prosperous times, wars, eco-

nomic downturns, political upheaval, society's changes have been felt by the people who lived here and worked in the mill.

Improvements to the machinery used in the mill, by Gardiner Hall Jr, meant new patents and design improvements that benefited thread mills everywhere. During war times the Hall Mill produced suture threads that were used on the battlefields of Europe. When the Great Depression devastated the United States the Hall Mill was able to employ over 130 people, when other businesses closed shop and unemployment was the norm. Willington and its population benefited from the operation of the Mill and as it grew so did the town.

William Henry Hall was active in politics and held elected offices in Connecticut. Because his interest lay in politics and not in the operation of the Mill this opened the door for Rosa Hall to step in and take over the business. A woman running a business of this size was not commonplace at that time. Ms. Hall was a forerunner in the advancement of women's rights and the suffrage movement. Rosa Hall was instrumental in the building of the Hall Memorial School in Willington as well as the Clara Hall Elliot Memorial Church.

There is this and so much more to learn about how the growth and development of Willington intertwined with the Hall family and their Mill. Please stop in on Wednesdays from 9:30 am until 11:30 am to learn about this remarkable period in our local history. If you have any artifacts you'd like to put on loan or donate to our museum please bring them along and share their story with us.
