

FRIENDLY REMINDER

This is a reminder to Willington taxpayers that the second installment of your real estate & personal property taxes billed July 1, 2010 and your motor vehicle supplemental taxes billed January 1, 2011, on the grand list of October 1, 2009, are due in full by February 1, 2011. After this date, the tax becomes delinquent and interest will be charged at a rate of 1 ½% per month (\$2.00 minimum), starting at 3% on February 2, 2011.

You can pay your tax bills in person at the Tax Collector's office in the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Rd. Public hours are Mon. 12:30 p.m.-7:30 p.m., Tues. through Fri. 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. If these hours are inconvenient, please use the payment drop box installed outside the Town Office Building.

If paying in person or using drop box, to avoid interest, you must do so **before** the close of business on February 1st. We will check the drop box at closing time on February 1st. We are closed New Year's Eve and Martin Luther King Day.

You must have your envelope post marked by February 1, 2011 to avoid paying interest. If you are requesting a receipt, please be sure to enclose a self addressed stamped envelope along with your payment.

You may also pay by credit card by calling 1-800-272-9829 or on line at www.officialpayments.com. Willington's jurisdiction code is 1707.

CLEANING OUT YOUR GARAGE THIS FALL?

The Willington Transfer Station is a resource you will need! Please remember to bring your Transfer Station permit and bulky waste card (available at the Selectmen's Office) and you can:

- Dispose of up to 3 cubic yards of bulky waste per week in the bulky waste bins. This includes furniture, and broken equipment
- Dispose of metals into the metal scrap bin
- Dispose of T.V.s, computers, fluorescent light bulbs and other electronics in the electronics bin
- Donate used bikes, sporting equipment, etc. in the Swap Shed for other Willington residents to reuse
- Donate clothing, shoes, towels and curtains to the Salvation Army
- Properly dispose of oil and antifreeze with the help of attendants
- Drop newspapers and magazines into the single stream recycling bin
- Donate leftover building materials to the Swap Shed
- Dispose of air conditioners, tires, refrigerators for a small fee – see attendant
- Donate bottles and cans to the Willington Cub Scouts
- Paint and all other hazardous waste can be brought to the Mid Nerac area on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month until the 1st week of November from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The Willington Transfer Station is open on Wed, Sat and Sunday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and attendants are there to help you know where to dispose of items.

After a trip (or two) to the Willington Transfer Station, your garage will be organized and ready for winter. Thank you for helping keep Willington clean!




and homemade. Drop off recipe at least one week prior to the event so we can compose a collection of


