General Info

From the Desk of the Assessor 2013 REVALUATION

The Town of Willington has contracted with Vision Government Solutions to complete a Town wide revaluation for 2013 Grand List. Vision will be working with the Assessor's office to make the project a successful one. The last revaluation was completed in 2008 and current state laws require towns to revalue every five years. A revaluation will determine the current fair market value of every property in town. The goal is to equalize the values of all properties for the purpose of a fair distribution of the tax burden.

The major phases to a municipal revaluation are: Data Collection, Market Analysis, Valuation, Field Review and Informal Hearings. You can visit the Vision Government Solutions website at www.vgsi.com for information that explains the revaluation process, and read answers to frequently asked questions. The data collection is finalized and we are currently working on building permits through October 2013.

The Valuation and Field Review phase started in August and will be finalized in October. Vision personnel will be driving through the town reviewing all properties to update the Assessor's database.

Upcoming municipal elections will be held on November 5, 2013. Voting will take place in the polling room, located on the main level of the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Road, from 6 am to 8 pm. Voters are reminded to bring identification. Plan ahead and make sure that you are registered to vote.

Registering to vote is an easy process and there are several methods for obtaining a voter application form:

• Applications may be downloaded from the Secretary of the State's website at www. ct.gov/sots or the Willington Registrars of Voters' link at www.willingtonct.org. After the application is filled out, printed and signed, mail it to: Registrars of Voters, 40 Old Farms Road, Willington CT 06279. Mail-in applications must be postmarked by October 22.

•Call the Registrars' office at 860 487-3120 and leave a clearly stated message, including your name and address, asking that an appli cation be sent. Completed applications may be returned by mail.

Mail-in applications must be postmarked by October 22.

• Register at the Registrars of Voters' office at the lower level of the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Road, on Tuesdays from 10 am to 12 pm.

• Register at the Town Clerk's office at the main level of the Town Office Building during business hours on Monday from 12:30 to 7:30 pm and Tuesday through Friday from 9 am to 2 pm.



 Applications are also available from the Willington Public Library and the Department of Motor Vehicles.

in the Community Room of the Willington Public Library. Please plan to stop by and wish her well as she begins this next phase of her life enjoying the time spent with family and friends.


