Voter registration information for the November elections

Upcoming state elections will be held on November 4, 2014. Voting will take place in the polling room, located on the main level of the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Road, from 6 am to 8 pm. Voters are reminded to bring identification.

Plan ahead and make sure that you are registered to vote. Registering to vote is an easy process and there are several methods for obtaining a voter application form:

- Register online at the Secretary of the State's website ct.gov/sots.
- Applications may be downloaded from the Registrars of Voters' link at www.willingtonct.org. After the application is filled out, printed and signed, mail to: Registrars of Voters, 40 Old Farms Road, Willington CT 06279. Mail-in applications must be postmarked by October 21.
- Call the Registrars' office at (860) 487-3120 and leave a clearly stated message, including your name and address, asking that an application be sent. Mail-in applications must be postmarked by October 21.
- Register at the Registrars of Voters' office at the lower level of the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Road, on Tuesdays from 10 am to 12 pm.
- Register at the Town Clerk's office at the main level of the Town Office Building during business hours on Monday from 12:30 to 7:30 pm and Tuesday through Friday from 9 am to 2 pm.
- Applications are also available at the Willington Public Library and the Department of Motor Vehicles.

There will be special Voter Registration Sessions held at the Registrars of Voters' office at the lower level of the Town Office Building on:

Saturday, October 18 from 10 am to 2 pm

Tuesday, October 28 from 9 am to 8 pm.



The Willington **HistoricalSocietyispleased** to announce that Arcadia Publishing recently added Willington to their series of over 8000 books about communities across the country. Willington residents Joe and Trish Froehlich co-authored the book, which is a pictorial history of



Willington. It includes 194 photographs with captions describing people, places, and events. Many past and present residents contributed photographs from their personal collections, although the majority of the photographs are from the Willington Historical Society's collection. The authors are donating all proceeds from the sale of the book to the Historical Society for use in restoring the Daniel Glazier Tavern, which will eventually be home to the Society's museum. The Historical Society is offering the books for \$20.00 each. They are available at the Town Clerk's office, along with other publications from the Society. Autographed copies will be available for sale at the Historical Society's booth at the Flea Market on the Town Green on Saturday, September 6, 2014.






