



∼ CONSERVATION COMMISSION SPRING EVENTS ∼

Last Green Valley

From mid-April through mid-June, The Last Green Valley, will be sponsoring a multitude of events to increase public awareness and appreciation for the water-related resources of the Quinebaug and Shetucket Rivers Valley National Heritage Corridor. www.thelastgreenvalley.org

As a part of this event, on Saturday June 6, 2009 10:00 AM, members of the Willington Conservation Commission will lead a one-mile round trip walk along a scenic section of Roaring Brook, whose rock-strewn, 20-30 foot wide river bed is flanked by mountain laurel and large oaks, pines, hemlocks and sycamores. The rapids, pools and clear, fast waters of this major tributary of the Willimantic River bring many fishermen to this Conn DEP-classified Class 3 Wild Trout Management Area. An important part of Connecticut's early history is reflected in the stonework remains of the foundations, sluiceways and millpond dams of three early to mid-eighteenth century water-powered mills. Steep, layered rock formations on the river bank lend an interesting geological note.

Directions: .15 miles north of the I-84 overpass on Rte 32 in Willington, turn right onto Village Hill Road. Go .3 miles to the parking area on the right just before the bridge over Roaring Brook.

The terrain is generally moderate on a natural trail, but with some steep slopes, rocks and some brushy areas. Recommended for children over 12. No dogs, please.
