Elderly and Totally Disabled Tax Relief **NOTICE**

Town of Willington Elderly Homeowner State Tax Credit Program

Elderly and totally disabled tax relief program applications must be filed with the Assessor's office between February 1, 2011 and May 15, 2011.

The State of Connecticut Program is available to residents of Willington who:

- Have attained the age of 65 on or before December 31, 2010.
- Hold full time residence in Willington.
- Received an income not exceeding \$32,300 for a single person or \$39,500 for a married couple.

Applications can be obtained at the Assessor's Office, Town Hall, 40 Old Farms Road, Monday 12:30 pm- 7:30 pm and Tuesday – Friday 9:00 am - 2:00 pm or one can be sent to you by mail if you call 860-487-3122 during the hours above.

Proof of income, social security and 1099 earnings required. Those persons who are already on the program but, required to renew have already been mailed an application.

Fishing & Hunting

Springtime on the way and that means its fishing season. Opening day for Trout Fishing is April 16, 2011. Licenses are available in our office or on line at www.ct.gov/dep. The Guide Books are available on line also at www.ct.gov/dep/fishing or www.ct.gov/dep/hunting and will be available in the town clerk's office in beginning of April. Check with the clerk's office. You can contact DEP by phone (860) 424-3105 with any additional questions. Any Connecticut Residents 65 years of age or older are entitled to a free license. Anyone with a "Lifetime" has to renew each year if you are a hunter or if you salt water fish. Make sure you bring in your old license with the conservation number on it.

Dog Licenses

June is the time to register your dog. You will receive renewal reminders at the end of May 2011. There is fee of \$8.00 for a spayed/neutered dog and a \$19.00 fee for male/female dog. You can license your dog in person or by mail. All dog license requests must be received in this office in person or in the office

via the mail by June 30th. An updated rabies certificate, if not current is required, a check payable to the Willington Town Clerk and a self addressed, stamped envelope should be included, if by mail. New dogs being registered would need the rabies certificate, spayed/neutered papers, check payable to Willington Town Clerk and a self addressed, stamped envelope, if mailed, for us to process your license. Please register your dog in June to avoid additional late fees as of July 1st. There is a \$1.00 per month and \$1.00 each additional month per state statute.

Passports

Passports are no longer processed in our office due to new government regulations. Forms are available online at pptctcsm@ state.gov Get your passport, as soon as possible, if you know you will be traveling. An approximate processing time is about 4 weeks to 6 weeks. The Probate Judge's Office in Tolland or the Storrs Post Office processes passports. The Probate Judge's telephone number is 860 871-3640 or the Storrs Post Office is 860 429-9681.

We are Notary Publics and can notarize documents. We will not notarize any documents that will be filed on the town land records or persons wills. There will be no fees for this service for town residents.

BOATING COURSE

Connecticut Safe Boating and Personal Watercraft Course. This single session, 8-hour course, taught by Professional Marine Education, provides a certificate of completion as partial fulfillment of the requirements



to obtain the Certification of Personal Watercraft Operation, which allows the operation of motorized recreational vessels up to 65' and sailboats 19 ½' in length and longer. Upon successful completion of this course, the student can mail or deliver the diploma to any State DEP office, and combined with an application for certificate (provided) and appropriate fee, qualifies the student to obtain the Certificate of Personal Watercraft Operation. The certificate is a one-time, lifetime certification. Students should bring a pen or pencil to class.



CONSERVATION COMMISSION NOTES

These notes are being written in January as the snows lie deep in the forests and on fields and trails. We hope that as you read this, though, Nature is coming out of hibernation and is busily greening up, blossoming forth and renewing herself in all her wondrous ways. Willington has many miles of hiking trails from which you can observe these seasonal transformations. The 300-acre Fenton-Ruby Park and Wildlife Preserve and Drobney Sanctuary on Moose Meadow Road has 4-plus miles of trails through woods, over ridges and along ponds and streams. A kiosk with maps is located at the parking area and a box with nature trail guides is located a short distance down the Taylor Trail. Brochures and trail maps can also be found at the Town clerk's office and the same information is available on the Conservation Commission website (see below). The 28-acre Talmadge Tract, which contains the Talmadge Spur Trail with 1 ½ and 2-mile loops, will take you through scenic woodlands and along gravel Mason Road. This tract abuts the 400-acre UConn Moss Forest Tract which now includes the 96-acre North Property. Several miles of the Connecticut Blue Trail run through this area with a portion along the Fenton River as it flows through a deep ravine. Trail access locations and further description can be found in brochures available at the library and Town Clerk's office.

The Conservation Commission will celebrate National and Connecticut Trails Day on Saturday June 4 with a special

event at Fenton-Ruby Park. Local naturalist Barbara Austin will reprise her well-received 2010 presentation on how locally available plants readily found in the surrounding forests and fields can be used as part of your next dining experience. Bring paper, pencil and a taste for culinary adventure to this outdoor demonstration. Following this taste of forest edibles, Barbara will lead an informative, leisurely hike in the surrounding woodlands that will introduce participants to more of the forest plants that possess nutritional and therapeutic values. Come help us celebrate Connecticut Trails Day on June 4th in the Fenton-Ruby Park and Drobney Wildlife Sanctuary in Willington. We will meet in the Fenton-Ruby Park parking lot (corner of Moose Meadow and Burma Roads) at 10:00 AM. Rain date is the following Sunday afternoon, June 5th from 2:00 – 4:00 PM. The event is free, but please call Chris at 429-8384 to register.

If you are interested in taking an active part in helping the Town manage its environmental resources, the Commission has openings for alternate members. Alternate members participate in meetings and may be seated as voting members in the absence of regular members. Anyone is welcome to attend our meetings in the lower level of the Town Office Building on the fourth Tuesday of every month. 

Willington Park Recreation Commission 2011 Update

The Willington Recreation Commission was reactivated in February of 2002 following a long absence. Former First Selectman John Patton made an effort at that time to assemble a group of townspeople who were involved in Willington town groups and commissions, and parents who were coaching their children playing organized sports locally. Two members from that reorganized group still sit on the commission today.

The Town Hall Office Field was new at this time, and it became a great facility for baseball, softball, and opening day events. Volunteers helped to maintain the field and built batting cages, dugouts, snack bar with a storage area, and installed a flagpole. Public Works provided mowing, but much of the cleanup and maintenance was done by players and their parents. So many townspeople helped out with money, time and equipment on this field, Center School and Hall School, that we were able to maintain and improve these fields. Most importantly, strong friendships were forged that helped to keep this cleanup and maintenance practice perennial.

A piece of property on River Road near the highway overpass was donated to the town for use as a sports facility and eventually provided Willington with its first regulation Little League field. A commission was formed to oversee the construction of the property. Once the process was underway, the Willington Recreation Commission assumed that responsibility. Like all small town recreational projects, money was hard to come by, and resources never stretched far enough. Capital improvement dollars were provided and spent, along with contributions and more volunteerism. Infrastructure for future water, power and communications was installed, as well as our Little League field and an all purpose field used mainly for soccer. A STEAP Grant (Small Town Economic Assistance Program) was obtained in 2010 with a scope of work including installation of a basketball court, volleyball court, playscape, pavilion, and 2,000' walking path. A piece of property once used to hold highway construction material is now a functioning park called the River Road Athletic Complex.

With a real park to care for the Willington Recreation Department now became the Willington Parks and Recreation Department and assumed the maintenance for the RRAC, Center School, Hall School and the Town Office Fields. Our present Parks and Recreation Director, Teri Gareau, has taken an enthusiastic approach to this department and collaborated with other towns adding many programs creating a universal appeal to the department for townspeople. Fencing, karate, Zumba, yoga, skating, skiing, basketball, golf, summer camp, volleyball, snowshoeing, kayaking, and archery programs, along with many others, give all age groups and ability levels a chance to "Get Up, Get Out and Get Moving". We have local high school seniors work with the department to complete their "senior projects". This is a program that helps keep the volunteering attitude strong with what may be our most important group of citizens and certainly our future town leaders.

Sitting on the Parks and Recreation Commission has given me a front row seat to what we can accomplish through cooperation, common sense and volunteerism. The Willington Board of Finance has listened to our group and come through with funding that is responsible and well used. Our Selectmen have always been willing to help the Commission with good advice and direction. Our local Boy Scout Troop has provided many projects that benefit the town's recreation programs. The townspeople of Willington, with their small town belief in lending a hand whenever possible or necessary, have been a mainstay volunteer force helping to keep our fields and equipment in good shape. During the construction of the RRAC we had a Judicial Community Service work crew volunteers help with the playscape under the direction of one of our commission members, and extra time and effort was provided by contractors on that site without compensation. Thanks to the Board of Finance our Parks and Recreation Department budget now includes field maintenance, allowing us to use professional help to keep the fields playable.

The Parks and Recreation Commission members along with our Parks and Recreation Director truly enjoy the work we are doing. We have been allowed to make a small department into a useful part of the Willington landscape. The hope is to someday watch a Little League or soccer game under the lights at the RRAC on a warm summer night with a hot dog and soda served up from the refreshment stand attached to the pavilion. A summer concert at the site, winter events like cross country skiing or skating, soccer and baseball playoff games, opening day for baseball, Willington Day, family picnics, and just taking a break to use the walking path or playscape with your children are all possible once the RRAC is completed. We are planning on having an opening day event this summer to introduce the park to Willington. Please look for our announcement and come enjoy the park that we have all worked for.
