

∼ FRIENDLY REMINDER ∼

This is a reminder to Willington taxpayers that the first installment of taxes billed in July 2009, on the assessment list of October 1, 2008, are due in full by August 3, 2009. After this date, the tax becomes delinquent and interest will be charged at a rate of 1.5% per month (\$2.00 minimum), starting at 3% on August 4, 2009.

You can pay your tax bills in person at the Tax Collector's office in the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Rd. Public hours are Mon. 12:30 p.m.-7:30 p.m., Tues. through Fri. 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. If these hours are inconvenient, please use the payment drop box installed outside the Town Office Building.

If paying in person or using drop box, to avoid interest, you must do so before the close of business on August 3rd. We will check the drop box at closing time on August 3rd. We are closed July 3, 2009 and July 6, 2009 for the Fourth of July holiday.

You can mail your tax payment using the green envelope enclosed with your tax bill. If you are requesting a receipt, please be sure to enclose a self addressed stamped envelope along with your payment. You must have your envelope post marked by August 3, 2009 to avoid paying interest.

Free Kayak Loaner Program

The Willington Parks and Recreation Department has obtained Kayak Equipment through a grant from Eastern Highlands Health District initiative "Healthy Eating, Active Living" (HEAL). All rentals include one life jacket and one paddle per kayak.

Reservations

Loaner equipment is available Monday-Friday. Special requests can be made in writing to the Director of Parks & Recreation for longer periods of time. The public may reserve for any service up to four weeks in advance. Reservations must be made at least 48 hours in advance. Only one open reservation will be allowed per household. After the completion of one reservation, another will be allowed. You may cancel your reservation up to 1 week prior to checkout of equipment without penalty. If you cancel inside 1 week of reserved checkout, you will forfeit your ability to rent again for the season unless the cancellation is due to documented family illness or severe weather conditions.





~ CONSERVATION COMMISSION SUMMER EVENTS **~**

Hike a new trail in Willington this summer!

The Conservation Commission has no formal activities planned for the summer months, but we hope you will have a chance to explore two beautiful hiking areas we have in Willington. Many of you have visited the 300-acre Fenton-Ruby Park and Wildlife Preserve and Drobney Sanctuary on Moose Meadow Road and have hiked the varied, wooded terrain on the 4-plus miles of trails. For those of you who have not, a kiosk with maps is located at the parking area and a box with nature trail guides is located a short distance down the Taylor Trail.

We'd like to highlight here some lesser known, but equally attractive, trails in the southeast part of Town. The Willington-owned Talmadge Tract and the contiguous UConn Moss Forest and the Conn. Forest and Parks Association (CFPA) North Property, contain trails through some highly picturesque rolling terrain in 430 acres of conserved open space. The 28-acre Talmadge Tract, which contains the Talmadge Spur Trail, was purchased by the Town with the help of a Connecticut DEP grant. The North property was donated to the town by Daniel North to be sold with the proceeds used for a library. 1 1/2, or 2-mile, loops will take you through a good part of this scenic forest.

We do not yet have printed maps of these trails, however, directions and trail descriptions of this area and trail maps for Fenton-Ruby Park are

Early mornings and evenings frequently offer the best chance to observe wildlife and are likely to be the most picturesque times to visit, but different times of the day all have their own attractions.

Teen Advisory Board


