#### FRIENDLY REMINDER

This is a reminder to Willington taxpayers that the first installment of taxes billed in July 2015, on the assessment list of October 1, 2014, are due in full by August 3, 2015. After this date, the tax becomes delinquent and interest will be charged at a rate of 1 1/2% per month (\$2.00 minimum), starting at 3% on August 4, 2015.

You can pay your tax bills in person at the Tax Collector's office in the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Rd. Public hours are Mon. June is the time to register your dog. You will receive renewal 12:30 p.m.-7:30 p.m., Tues. through Fri. 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. If these hours are inconvenient, please use the payment drop box installed outside the Town Office Building.

If paying in person or using drop box, to avoid interest, you must do so before the close of business on August 3rd. We will check the drop box at closing time on August 3rd.. We are closed July 2 & 3, 2015 for the Holiday.

You can mail your tax payment using the green envelope enclosed with your tax bill. If you are requesting a receipt, please be sure to enclose a self addressed stamped envelope along with your payment. You must have your envelope post marked by August 3, 2015 to avoid paying interest. interest.

You can now look up and pay your bills on line by going to www.willingtonct.org - Go to Town Depts. - Go to Revenue Collection Dept. -Click on link "view and or pay my tax bill". Type in last nameleave a space and type in your first initial (Doe J). Click on search and you will be able to see your bills. Follow instructions on screen.


#### **Fishing & Hunting**

Springtime will be in the air and that means fishing season. Opening day for Trout Fishing is April 18, 2015. Licenses are available in the Town Clerk's Office on the 1st day of January 2015 or on line at www.ct.gov/deep. The Guide Books are available on line at www. ct.gov/deep/fishing or www.ct.gov/deep/hunting and will be in the Town Clerk's office. You can contact DEEP by phone (860) 424-3105 with any additional questions. Any Connecticut Residents 65 years of age or older are entitled to a free license. Anyone with a "Lifetime" has to renew each year if you are a hunter or if you salt water fish. Make sure you bring in your old license with the conservation number on it.




#### TRIP TO THE RIDER TAVERN

The Society will be traveling to the historic Rider Tavern (C.1797), located in Charlton, Massachusetts on June 13, 2015. The Rider Tavern is considered one of the least altered and best documented examples of a wayside tavern, of the Federal period, in New England. In 1824 General Lafayette visited and was entertained.
