



This is a reminder to Willington taxpayers that the second installment of your real estate & personal property taxes billed July 1, 2009 and your motor vehicle supplemental taxes billed January 1, 2010, on the grand list of October 1, 2008, are due in full by February 1, 2010. After this date, the tax becomes delinquent and interest will be charged at a rate of 1 1/2% per month (\$2.00 minimum), starting at 3% on February 2, 2010.

You can pay your tax bills in person at the Tax Collector's office in the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Rd. Public hours are Mon. 12:30 p.m.-7:30 p.m., Tues. through Fri. 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. If these hours are inconvenient, please use the payment drop box installed outside the Town Office Building.

If paying in person or using drop box, to avoid interest, you must do so before the close of business on February 1st. We will check the drop box at closing time on February 1st. We are closed New Year's Day and Martin Luther King Day.

If you are requesting a receipt, please be sure to enclose a self addressed stamped envelope along with your payment. You must have your envelope post marked by February 1, 2010 to avoid paying interest.

GARDENING

Trillium Landscape Design Gardening Program 2010 In Conjunction with Willington Parks and Recreation

5 Sessions: To meet 4th Monday of March, April, May, June and August

March 22, 2010

Seeds and Seeding: How to start your plants from seed. An up close and personal look at seeds, what they are and how to get them to do what you want! We will explore techniques for seed germination, transplanting seedlings, growing on, hardening-off and other really cool stuff to get your garden "sprouting" this spring. Prepare to get your hands dirty trying this in class.

April 26, 2010

Native Plants for Spring Gardens: Identification and proper placement of native plants in your landscape, with tips for rebuilding the natural plant communities in your yard. This class to be held at an outdoor location, with native plant walk, weather permitting.

May 24, 2010 (rain date - May 26, 2010) Composting, Soil Building, and Weedless Gardening. Hands -on project starting a new garden from scratch! Get down and dirty building a planting area (at a site to be announced), while learning about soil and how it affects your plants, and how you really can have a weed-less garden.

June 28, 2010 Fruits are not just for the nutty! There are a lot of backyard (and front yard!) edible landscaping options. We will explore some old favorites and some unusual choices.

August 23, 2010 Fall Gardening - from lawns to flowers to veggie gardens, there are many gardening opportunities in the fall. It's not too early to plan for winter. We will consider some of the best things to do for your garden this time of year.

It can help those suffering from various difficult physical conditions, like back pain and arthritis. The techniques taught are appropriate for beginners, older adults as well as advanced yoga students.

In October, the Willington Conservation Commission, together with the commissions from Ashford, Chaplin, Eastford and Hampton, co-sponsored a successful workshop on protecting family farms and forests. The more than 50 attendees at Knowlton Hall in Ashford heard about land protection options from foresters, tax attorneys, land trusts, the Green Valley Institute and folks who have already conserved their family lands.

At a fall work day at Fenton-Ruby Park, trails were surfaced with woodchips, a trail was re-routed to avoid wet areas and 3 bridges were constructed. We encourage folks to visit the Park and the Talmadge Trail and Blue Trail off Mason Road. Trail maps and brochures canusually be found at the kiosk at the parking area at Fenton-Ruby, at the Library and at the Town Clerk's office. The Fenton-Ruby trail map is also available on the town website: (willingtonct.org, Bds and Commissions, Conserv. Comm.) Winter, and especially a fresh snowfall, give the forest landscape a whole new perspective. The Parks & Recreation Department now has snowshoes to loan if you'd like to try that experience. Contact Parks & Recreation Director Teri Gareau at 487-3108 for information on borrowing equipment.

We are still waiting for final Conn. DEP approval of the surveys and documents necessary to finalize the purchase of the 135-acre Knowlton property on Mason Road. By spring time we hope to be considering management and use options on that terrific addition to Willington's open space.


