

From the Desk of the First Selectman:

Dear Willington Residents:

On behalf of the Board of Selectmen, I'd like to thank all of our residents who voted in our municipal election on November 5th. I am honored to say that I have been re-elected as your First Selectman, along with Kim Kowalyshyn and John Blessington as Selectmen and all three of us are committed to working together for the betterment of the town. John has been on the Board of Selectmen for years and Kim is new (however, she has most recently served as the Economic Development Chairwoman for the past few years and is very knowledgeable about town business.) The Board meets on the 1st and 3rd Monday of every month at 6:30pm in the Town Office Building and our meetings are open to the public.

At the time of this printing the new Board members for the various Boards, including Board of Selectmen, Board of Finance, and Board of Education, have not even taken their oaths of office yet, however, we are already making preparations to budget for the next fiscal year that starts on July 1, 2014. Over the next few months, there will be many discussions about programs and services and how we will plan to fund them given increasing costs. The people who sit on the various Boards will ultimately make the important decisions that will lead to a proposed budget for 2014-2015 that will be voted on in the budget referendum in May.

Supplemental Bills Friendly Reminder

This is a reminder to Willington taxpayers that the second installment of your real estate & personal property taxes billed July 1, 2013 and your motor vehicle supplemental taxes billed January 1, 2014, on the grand list of October 1, 2012, are due in full by February 3, 2014. After this date, the tax becomes delinquent and interest will be charged at a rate of 1 1/2% per month (\$2.00 minimum), starting at 3% on February 4, 2014.







The Willington Scholarship Foundation, an affiliate of Dollars for Scholars, will hold its Annual Open Meeting on Monday, November 18, at 7:00 p.m. in the Common Room upstairs in the Willington Town Hall on Old Farms Road. The public is cordially invited to attend.

WSF has been in existence since 1995. Since our founding 304 scholarships totaling approximately 205,000 dollars have been awarded to graduating Willington seniors.

Our scholarships are based solely on academic excellence. The Board of directors obtain the needed information from the students' high school with the written permission of each student applicant. The recipients' names are not know to the members of the board during the process of designating the awards.

Funding for the scholarships is dependent on the generous support of Willington residents and businesses as well as the P.T.A. WSF is a non-profit organization. The members of the Board of Directors are volunteers. They meet once a month during the school year with their main goals being to prepare mailings which are sent out in February each year, collect the donations and award the scholarships in June.
