

TOWN OF WILLINGTON REVENUE COLLECTION DEPARTMENT SUPPLEMENTAL BILLS

FRIENDLY REMINDER

This is a reminder to Willington taxpayers that the second installment of your real estate & personal property taxes billed July 1, 2011 and your motor vehicle supplemental taxes billed January 1, 2012, on the grand list of October 1, 2010, are due in full by February 1, 2012. After this date, the tax becomes delinquent and interest will be charged at a rate of 1 ½% per month (\$2.00 minimum), starting at 3% on February 2, 2012.

You can pay your tax bills in person at the Tax Collector's office in the Town Office Building, 40 Old Farms Rd. Public hours are Mon. 12:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m., Tues. through Fri. 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. If these hours are inconvenient, please use the payment drop box installed outside the Town Office Building.

If paying in person or using drop box, to avoid interest, you must do so before the close of business on February 1st. We will check the drop box at closing time on February 1st. We are closed for New Year's Day on January 2, 2012 and Martin Luther King Day on January 16, 2012.

You must have your envelope post marked by February 1, 2012 to avoid paying interest. If you are requesting a receipt, please be sure to enclose a self addressed stamped envelope along with your payment.

You may also pay by credit card by calling 1-800-272-9829 or on line at *www.officialpayments.com*. Willington's jurisdiction code is 1707.

TOWN OFFICE BUILDING GETS A FACELIFT

If you have stopped in the Town Office Building recently, you may have noticed some improvements.

One major improvement is the installation of several energy efficient windows. These windows were paid for by an Energy Efficiency Community Block Grant (\$42,000) that was granted to the town in 2009. This money was part of the American Recovery Reinvestment Act. After careful analysis and consideration, the Willington Energy Advisory Committee recommended that energy efficient windows would be the best investment in terms of energy conservation and the windows were installed this summer. In addition, the doors have been painted as well as the trim and this work is being done by Community Service volunteers. Not only has this changed the look of our building for the better, it is saving the town money in energy costs every day.

Another improvement to the building is the floor replacement and wall painting in the main entrance. The old floor was becoming dangerous as it was beginning to crack and create an uneven walking surface. With minimal funds, we were able to replace the VCT floor and covebase. In addition, town employees volunteered time after work and painted the hallway and doors giving it a more welcoming look.

The improvement our Board Members are most excited about is the new floor and paint in the downstairs meeting room. This room would routinely flood due to gutter issues (that have since been resolved) and the floor was damaged beyond repair. The replacement was covered by insurance and is not only functional, it makes the room more comfortable.

There also has been a lot of painting of offices and outside trim done by employees and residents who have volunteered their time and talent. We are very fortunate to have these people in town who care not just about our Town Office Building, but all of our municipal properties.





Storm Alfred Wrap Up

power were lost and the station was running on genera-

As everyone in town is well aware, we all endured a historic fall snowstorm on October 29th, 2011. Storm Alfred dumped at least 10-15 inches of heavy snow in Willington which brought down countless trees and utility poles and wires. Many roads were impassable for days and 100% of the town was without power following the storm. School was canceled for a week, trick-or-treating was postponed and some of our residents were out of power for a full 12 days.

Within hours of the storm, an emergency shelter was opened at Hall Memorial School. Cots were provided by the Red Cross, water and MRE's (Meals Ready to Eat) were provided by FEMA (and some delivered by the National Guard) and countless volunteers and town/school employees worked for days to serve our residents. While over 40 residents stayed overnight at the shelter at it's peak, hundreds of residents visited daily to get restoration information, water, hot meals, showers and to recharge their phones and check their email. We were very fortunate to have the school on a generator, which ended up running for 9 days and served the building and community very well.

Also within hours of the storm, the Emergency Operation Center was activated and after a brief analysis, it was decided to be located at the Fire Station on Rt. 32. However.

would allow an open line of communication with Public Works

and state agencies. Neither of the schools nor the Town Office Building had power or phones and the internet server was down so it was



near impossible to communicate with each other and residents in our usual ways.

It was clear that we needed to communicate with our residents and we quickly got signs up around town directing people to the shelter for information. We also managed to write, print and copy a public notice (using generator power) and had a copy delivered to every mailbox in town. This was thanks to many volunteers, particularly the Cub Scouts, who took this assignment and ran with it.

While we all struggled with the inconveniences and safety concerns that Alfred brought, it made me proud to see how many people came out to help their neighbors and community. From the homeowners clearing branches in the roads, to volunteers who worked the night shift at the shelter, to our dedicated Fire Fighters and our hard working Public Works crew, I saw example after example of why our town is such a great place to live.

In the coming weeks, we will be doing an analysis of what went right and what could have been better in our Town response efforts. We will also be sending suggestions to CL&P and the Governor. For now, please join me in thanking the many people who got us through this and please pass on your suggestions to the Board of Selectmen for our consideration.
